Through SFI chain-of-custody certification, companies must have a tracking system in place so they can tell customers the amount of certified, uncertified and recycled content in the forest products they buy, use or sell.

Currently McShan produces 80% boards, about half of which is exported. In 2009 McShan shipped lumber to 27 countries.
